## Course Description

This course is a one-semester course designed to acquaint students with the basic concepts of sewing, including pattern and fabric selection, layout, construction, finishing, hand and machine sewing. Fashion Design is a service-learning project-based class and all projects will be done in class. Students may not take any sewing projects home until they have been completed and graded.

Sufficient class time will be provided to students to complete the projects assigned. Students will be expected to attend class and complete the assigned work. If a student does not stay on task, they will not complete the work and will have to come in **before** school to work on their project. All major projects have a participation bonus attached to completing the project on time.

Projects will be graded based on completion, neatness, and following the teacher's instructions.

## Supplies

While most supplies will be provided by the school, the finished projects may be donated and/or made available for sale. The students will be creating projects similar to the following: pin cushion, bandana bib, and girl's sun dress.

While there will be tools and materials available, most students find it more rewarding and satisfying to have their own. A basic sewing kit contains the following:

- Plastic shoe box / sewing box
- 2 pair of scissors (inexpensive for paper, quality for fabric)
- Straight pins and pin cushion
- Cloth tape measure
- Seam ripper
- Hand sewing needles

For those students who do not wish to supply their own supplies, the school will provide basic supplies to learn the concepts and complete the projects. Projects made with supplies provided by the student will belong to the students and can be taken home after they have been graded. Projects made with supplies provided by the school will belong to the school and may be donated or made available for sale.

## Make-Up Work
